

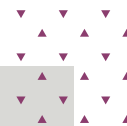

Frequently Asked Questions

MSc in Leadership, Innovation & Technology

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► What is the course schedule?

The programme is delivered through a series of scheduled full-day sessions rather than weekly evening lectures. Classes typically take place on Fridays and occasional Saturdays, from 9.00 am to 5.00 pm.

There is also an initial programme induction and orientation session held in September. Teaching is delivered in a blended format, with sessions taking place either online or on campus at TU Dublin's Aungier Street location. Full details and confirmed dates can be found on the course page under "Delivery".

► What is the fee?

The granted aided fee for 2026 is €3,895. Please reach out to the team for more information. Payments are made on a yearly basis.

► Are instalment payments available?

We offer payment plans starting three months prior to the course commencement. However, all fees must be settled in full before the course begins.

► What is the final award?

The final award is a Level 9 NFQ qualification, equivalent to 90 ECTS credits.

► Are there exams?

There are no exams on this programme. The assessment strategy for each of the six modules in Phase 1 is exclusively based on work-based project assignments and reflective learning submissions. The final award of the Master's degree is linked to the assessment of the research project undertaken by the participant, with support from the college.

► Are there group projects?

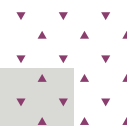
Yes, group projects and assignments are included. These are designed to promote peer learning.

► Is there tax relief if so, can you claim back any tax?

You may be eligible to apply for tax relief; however, it is the responsibility of each applicant to contact the tax office for further information. A receipt for fees paid can be provided upon request.

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► **For applicants, whose first language is not English are they required to provide evidence of English language proficiency?**

Yes, there is a requirement to complete an English Language test for applicants, whose first language is not English. Please consult TU Dublin's website.

► **Are classes recorded?**

Classes are not recorded. Attendance is expected as part of the peer-learning experience.

► **Are assignments linked to my current job?**

Yes. Many assignments encourage participants to apply concepts directly to their organisation and professional context.

► **Can I complete the programme while working full-time?**

Yes. The programme has been designed specifically for working professionals and is delivered on a part-time basis over two years.

► **Do you provide Visa support?**

Please note that neither TU Dublin nor Technology Ireland ICT Skillnet provide visa support services for this course. Applicants are responsible for ensuring they have the appropriate visa in place prior to applying.
