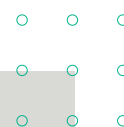

► Who are the programme partners and what are their roles?

► How long does the programme take to complete?

The programme takes 12 weeks to complete on a part-time basis.

► Is the course accredited?

Yes, it is an NFQ Level 8 / 10 ECTS Continuing Professional Diploma.

► What are the academic entry requirements?

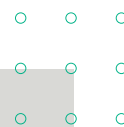
This programme is designed for individuals from both AI and non-AI backgrounds with an interest and aptitude for transitioning into AI disciplines. Applicants should have strong quantitative aptitude and hold a Level 8 (NFQ) primary degree. The degree should be in a cognitive discipline but it is not a necessity.

► What are the funding eligibility requirements?

Applicants must be residing in Ireland and currently employed in a private company or commercial semi-state organisation registered in the Republic of Ireland.

Unfortunately, those employed in the public sector are not eligible for funding. However, you may still apply, and we can introduce you to Krisolis to discuss private (non-funded) application options.

We regret that we cannot support unemployed applicants on this course, but we encourage you to visit www.futureintech.ie for alternative opportunities.



► How do I apply?

All applicants must first apply to Technology Ireland ICT Skillnet for initial eligibility screening. If you are deemed eligible, you will be provided with a link to the TU Dublin student application portal to begin your official academic assessment. Detailed steps will be provided to students at this point.

If your application to TU Dublin is successful, Technology Ireland ICT Skillnet will issue a payment/registration link. Once payment is received, both TU Dublin and Krisolis will be notified.

Due to high demand, places will be granted on a first-come, first-served basis, based on payment received by Technology Ireland ICT Skillnet, not solely on receiving an offer.

► Do I have to attend lectures in person?

No. The programme is delivered entirely online over 12 weeks, with live online classes every Tuesday and Thursday from 6:30pm to 9:00pm. Additional course content includes video recordings, readings, exercises and assignments.

► Do I pay any additional fees apart from the Skillnet subsidised fee?

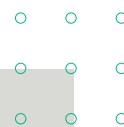
No. The only fee you are required to pay is the subsidised amount to Technology Ireland ICT Skillnet. Please disregard any fee references on the TU Dublin website, as they do not apply to this programme.

Technology Ireland ICT Skillnet will provide you with two promotional codes to waive the fees at the appropriate stages: the first during the initial application and the second after your payment to Technology Ireland ICT Skillnet has been received.

► What documents are required for my application to TU Dublin?

The following documents must be submitted as part of your application:

- Up-to-date CV
- Personal statement, which is a short statement (150–200 words or more) outlining your interest in the course, and to include details of your numeracy, analytical, and/or technical skills and experience
- Copy of your passport
- Transcript of your highest NFQ qualification, which must be in English
- GNIB/IRP status (if you are not an EU citizen)



► How do I provide feedback?

As part of the funding requirements, you will be asked to complete a short feedback survey issued by Technology Ireland ICT Skillnet and Krisolis at the end of the course. Your input is greatly valued and helps us to continually improve and shape future course offerings.
