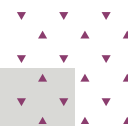

Frequently Asked Questions



▶ **What is the course schedule?**

Lectures are held on two evenings per week. In the first year, the lecturers are normally on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6.30 to 9.00 pm. There will also be a requirement to attend one on-campus day at the end of each semester.

Orientation and lectures always take place on Friday and Saturday within the last two weeks of January from 9 am-5 pm.. The official dates can be found on the course page under "Delivery".

▶ **What is the fee?**

The fees for 2025 are not confirmed. Please reach out to the team for more information. Payments are made on a yearly basis.

▶ **Are instalment payments available?**

We offer payment plans starting three months prior to the course commencement. However, all fees must be settled in full before the course begins.

▶ **What is the final award?**

The final award is a Level 9 NFQ qualification, equivalent to 90 ECTS credits.

▶ **Are there exams?**

There are no exams on this programme. The assessment strategy for each of the six modules in Phase 1 will be exclusively linked to workbased project assignments and reflective learning submissions. The final award of the master's degree will be linked to the assessment of the research project undertaken by the participant with the support of the college.

▶ **Are there group projects?**

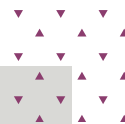
Yes, there are group projects/assignments. Group work is to promote peer learning.
