



MSc in Sustainable Cloud Computing

Frequently Asked Questions

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► Is the course accredited?

Yes, it is an NFQ Level 9, Master of Science in Computing with Sustainable Cloud Computing.

► What are the academic entry requirements for the course?

Computing and Information Technology Graduates at 2.2 or higher.

Honours graduates (Level 8) with a major in Computing or Information Technology, at a minimum award level of second-class grade two honours are eligible for entry to the programme. (Students with a lower grade of Level 8 award than a 2.2 and some years of suitable experience may also qualify for admission.)

Honours Graduates (Level 8) in Equivalent Cognate Fields with an award at 2.2. or higher.

Applicants with an Honours Bachelor's Degree (Level 8) or equivalent in a relevant field such as Science, Mathematics, Engineering, or Business IS/MIS at a minimum second-class honours grade 2 (2.2) level will be considered for entry if their prior work experience provides a suitable foundation for the programme. Candidates with a Level 8 qualification below 2.2 may also be eligible for admission if they have sufficient relevant experience.

► How do I apply?

Candidates should first apply to Technology Ireland ICT Skillnet for initial eligibility screening.

Once your eligibility is confirmed, we will send you the link to the TU Dublin application portal. If your application is successful, ICT Skillnet will issue a payment/registration link.

Once payment is received, TU Dublin will be notified.

► What are the fees?

The full course fee is €4,250 per year. The Technology Ireland ICT Skillnet grant-aided reduced fee is €3,495* per year.

*Subsidised fees are only available to Applicants working in a private or commercial semi-state organisation registered in the Republic of Ireland

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▶ What is the recommended time commitment / hours required per week?

4 to 5 hours per module per week in addition to the actual live online classes. This will include independent work on continuous assignments, lab deployments etc.

▶ What documents are required for my application to TU Dublin?

The following documents must be submitted as part of your application:

1. Up-to-date CV
2. Copy of your passport
3. Transcript of your highest NFQ qualification (must be in English)
4. GNIB/IRP status (if you are not an EU citizen)

▶ How long does the programme take to complete?

The MSc programme takes a two-year part time commitment to complete.

▶ What is the requirement for an English language qualification

If English is not your first language you will need to provide evidence of your English language proficiency as detailed on the TU Dublin website.

Applicants for this programme should have a minimum IELTS (Academic Version) English Proficiency of 6 overall (or equivalent) with nothing less than 6 in each component.

▶ How is the course delivered?

This two-year part-time course is delivered online two evenings per week (6-8:30 pm). An initial two-day session is delivered online at the start of each year. Some optional additional on campus events may also be held.

▶ Are further details on the module content available?

▶ Are exams held on campus?

No, the exams are fully online.



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
